The challenges in our state have never been greater. As members of OSLC and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, our desire to help address those challenges by serving our neighbor is in our blood. We have heard Christ’s command to “love one another” and we want to help, but sometimes we are not sure how.

One way you can help your neighbors is through our partnership with Lutheran Services Carolinas, or LSC, one of the six institutional affiliates of the South Carolina Synod. Formerly known as Lutheran Family Services, LSC is a mission-based human services organization whose professional staff members are skilled in assisting individuals facing a variety of life challenges. In South Carolina alone, LSC provides more than \$9 million in services each year on our behalf to serve our neighbors.

LSC has been approved by the Synod Council of the SC Synod of the ELCA to conduct a capital campaign in congregations between January 1, 2018, and December 31, 2019. As you may know, this opportunity rotates among the affiliated organizations of the Synod and LSC has not had an opportunity to launch such a campaign in South Carolina since 1998. LSC kicked off its \$1 million Love One Another campaign at the 2018 Synod Assembly and announced 2 additional challenge goals totaling \$200,000 bringing the total goal for the Campaign to \$1.2 million. Efforts are now underway to share the message about LSC’s work and what it hopes to accomplish next in South Carolina. Please know that all funds raised during this campaign will be used for services in South Carolina and will not be used for administrative fundraising expenses.

The campaign will concentrate on raising funds to support three primary service areas: Guiding Young People Transitioning Out of Foster Care across the state; Welcoming the Stranger through refugee services in the Charleston metro area and the Midlands; and

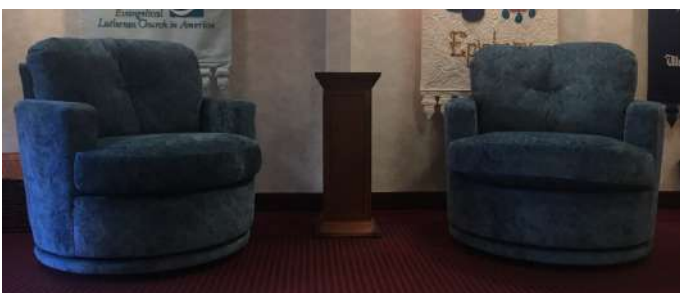
## LUTHER: THE ROCK OPERA

FEBRUARY 2019

- A Spring flyer will be printed and sent to the community announcing Lenten and Easter services along with Shred Day and worship service information.
- The Property Team submitted a list of needed maintenance/repairs to the building. Urgent leaking repairs to the roof will be the first priority.
- A small freezer chest was approved for purchase to add freezer storage, especially during Souper Bowl time.

## COMMEMORATION PROFILES

*Ruth Nicholson*

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



**March 10**  
**Harriet Tubman**  
**Renewer of Society**  
**(1821-1913)**

Born into slavery in Maryland, Harriet Tubman fled north, using the stars to guide her, around 1849. During the 1850's she repeatedly ventured back into slave territory to lead hundreds of slaves, including her parents, to freedom, as the "Moses" of her people. Tubman was part of the Underground Railroad, a network of safe houses and assistance for slaves desiring to escape. During the Civil War she served the Union army as cook, nurse, and spy. For the rest of her life, Harriet Tubman was in charge of a home for poor and elderly African-Americans in Auburn, New York.

**March 10**  
**Sojourner Truth,**  
**Renewer of society**  
**(ca. 1797-1883)**

Also born into slavery, Isabella Baumfree ran away when her master ignored New York State's emancipation act of 1827. She joined a religious cult in New York City but rejected its practices in 1843, renaming herself Sojourner Truth. That was the start of her travels as an evangelist, during which she preached against slavery and for the rights of women. After the Civil War, Sojourner Truth continued her work on behalf of women, and she helped former slaves get established in their new lives.

**March 17**  
**Patrick, Bishop**  
**Missionary to Ireland**  
**(ca. 389-461)**

Well-known as Ireland's patron saint, Patrick first came to that country from Roman Britain as a slave. After six years there as a shepherd, he escaped and returned home. He had become devoted to Christianity and decided to study for the priesthood. His return to Ireland in 432 was the beginning of his determined effort to convert more of the populace to Christianity. He founded new religious communities and helped to solidify the hold of the Western church on Ireland. A hymn attributed to Patrick, "I Bind Unto Myself Today," appears as Hymn 450 in our ELW.

**March 24**  
**Oscar Arnulfo Romero,**  
**Bishop of El Salvador, Martyr**  
**(1917-1980)**

Born in the mountains of El Salvador and trained first as a carpenter, Oscar Romero chose the priesthood and studied for it in his country and in Rome. After he became a bishop in El Salvador in 1970, Romero preached against government repression and defended the rights of poor people there. He and like-minded advocates of justice were in danger during a time of political turmoil. After several threats on his life, Bishop Romero was assassinated while he presided at Holy Communion on March 24, 1980.

**March 31**  
**John Donne, Poet**  
**(1572-1631)**

Born in London, raised Roman Catholic, John Donne converted to Anglicanism as an adult. He studied at Oxford and Cambridge and seemed destined for a secular career. After military service and life as a courtier, Donne fell on hard times when his father-in-law cut off funds to Donne and his wife. Donne struggled spiritually, as well, and joined the priesthood in 1615. His preaching made him famous, and he was named Dean of St. Paul's Cathedral in 1621. However, he is recognized today more for his poetry than for his piety. Students of literature know him as one of the "metaphysical poets."

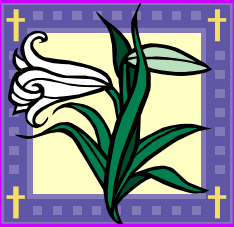
