COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Ann Satterwhite, Council Secretary May 2019

- 6,280 was pledged to Lutheran Services Carolinas.
- Food gift cards were sent to our seven college students during exam time to let them know they are in our thoughts and prayers.
- The beautiful cross and painting created by Bob Graham, and given by the Mabel Miller family, was dedicated on April 28, 2019.
- The Building Maintenance and Property Improvement (BMPI) Team recommended repairs/maintenance for the outside painting of the church, repair of windows in the Sanctuary and Bell Room; roof repairs; lighting replacement and in the Sanctuary. The will be total \$24,438.48. Council approved and a Called Meeting of the Congregation was held on May 19, 2019 for approval of these expenditures. The recommendation from Council to expend these funds from the BMPI fund was unanimously approved.
- June 30th will be the next "Fifth Sunday Service" and will be held in the Fellowship Hall. Special Music and a patriotic luncheon will follow the service.
- Graduation Sunday will be on June 2nd to honor Claire and Adam Fingerlin.

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



June 1 Justin, martyr at Rome (c.100 - c.165)

Born into a pagan family of Samaria, Justin became a devoted student of philosophy. His search for truth resulted in his conversion to Christianity, after which he taught at Ephesus and Rome and wrote treatises in defense of his religion. He and several of his students were denounced in Rome as Christians. When they refused to make a pagan sacrifice, they were beheaded.

June 5 Boniface, Bishop of Mainz, missionary to Germany, martyr (680-754)

Born an Englishman, Boniface is remembered best in Germany, for it is there that most of his life's work took place. As a young priest, Boniface went to Rome to ask the pope's permission to be a missionary to the German people. He spent the rest of his life preaching and setting up church organization there. He died at the hands of pagans during a missionary journey among the Frisians.

June 9 Columba, Aidan, and Bede, renewers of the church

Columba (c.521 -597), Aidan (died 651), and (673-735) kept Christianity and Bede learning alive in the British Isles during the Dark Ages. A nobleman from Donegal, Columba founded churches and monasteries in his native Ireland before establishing a monastery on the island of Iona near Scotland. From that location he and followers accomplished his the conversion of Scotland. Aidan, also Irish by birth, was sent from lona to the island of Lindisfarne. From there he made many journeys to do mission work on the English mainland. It is said that he died of grief after the murder of his Christian friend and patron. King Oswald of Northumbria. Bede, often referred to as "the Venerable Bede," was one of the finest English scholars of his time. He wrote on many subjects but is best remembered as the author of Ecclesiastical History of the English People. Unlike Columba and Aidan, Bede never traveled far from his home monastery. His reliaious writings include the Latin words of ELW #393 ("A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing!").
