Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

In my conversations with other pastors throughout the COVID era, I have been happy to report that stewardship at OSLC has continued to remain strong. I thank God for this. It has made a difficult context in which we are still called to do ministry a bit easier. But I also thank you. The members of this congregation continue to treat giving like it is just something a Christian does. And we want to make it easier, so we have partnered with Vanco, an online giving resource.

We chose Vanco for two reasons. 1) I contacted PowerChurch, our church software provider and spoke to their technical service department. I wanted to know which of the online giving resource companies "plays nicest" with their software. He suggested Vanco immediately and told me about the long history PowerChurch and Vanco share. We want this to be a smooth process and that sounded good to me. 2) All online giving resources charge a small fee for this service and the ELCA has already negotiated a good rate that congregations can take advantage of. That ended my search. I did not have to try and shop for better percentages and transaction fees. It had already been taken care of!

So how will this work? If you can buy a box of tissues from Amazon, you can be an online giver. Our website will—this month—have an online giving button that will link you to the OSLC online giving page hosted by Vanco. There you will see a selection of different funds to which you can give (with all our own photos and descriptions). Initially, you will be able to

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



June 3 John XXIII, Bishop of Rome (1881-1963)

Born Angelo Roncalli in northern Italy, the future pope came from a farming family with thirteen children. His career in the Catholic Church began with seminary and the priesthood. He was a military chaplain in World War I. During World War II, while an apostolic delegate to Istanbul, he helped a boatload of Jewish refugees to safety. He advanced to higher positions in the church and was elected pope at age seventy-six in 1958. He convened the Second Vatican Council in 1962 to bring his church more in tune with the modern world. Pope John XXIII was known for his humility and was mourned worldwide when he died. In 2014. Pope Francis conferred sainthood on him.

June 25 Philipp Melanchthon, Renewer of the church (1497-1560)

Philipp Melanchthon was educated in his native Germany, where he focused on Greek classics and Hebrew scriptures. As a professor, he taught that history and archaeology are vital for understanding the Bible. Luther's influence brought him to the forefront of the Reformation as a compiler of Lutheran teachings and defender of the Augsburg Confession, of which he was the chief author. It was on June 25, 1530, that

the Augsburg Confession was presented to Emperor Charles of the Holy Roman Empire. Melanchthon led the reform movement after Luther's death.

June 27 Cyril, Bishop of Alexandria (c. 375-444)

A native of Alexandria, Egypt, Cyril served as its bishop from 412 to 444. He was a fervent defender of the combined humanity and divinity of Jesus against those who saw Jesus as two separate identities side by side in one Cyril's term of service was one of beina. turmoil as he argued for his beliefs, closed churches, drove out Jews, some and quarreled with civil authorities in Later in life he became more area. conciliatory toward others, but his best legacy is his theological writings rather than his actions as bishop. In 1882, Pope Leo XIII named Cyril one of the Doctors of the Church.

WELCA RELEASES NEW HOSPITALITY TEAM GUIDELINES

The following page lists the latest guidelines for the Hospitality Teams.



OSLC-WELCA HOSPITALITY GUIDELINES Adopted May 25, 2021

INFORMATION: The Hospitality Teams/Groups have been a part of this congregation for a long time – the only thing that changed has been the name/terminology. The women of the church have always prepared meals in time of need – whether in sickness or death. In addition, get well, thinking of you, and sympathy cards are normally sent by WELCA and other groups in the Church. It is the purpose of this document to set forth some clarity in guidelines for the Coordinators and the Groups as we now have them set up regarding the meals and/or memorials.

I. SICKNESS/HOSPITALIZATION

The coordinator(s) will be the general contact by the Pastor or another church member to make them aware of the possibility and/or need of some assistance to a church family member and/or active person in the life of Our Saviour's congregation. The coordinator will, if contacted by a church member, notify the Pastor and the OSLC-WELCA President of the request and proceed as follows:

- A meal will be offered to a member family and/or active family in the congregational life of this church when a sickness involves <u>hospitalization</u> overnight.
- (2) If the member family/active family had out-patient surgery.
- (3) This will be done for the immediate family to include spouse, child, mother, or father. A gift card to a local restaurant may be provided in place of a meal. The amount will be determined by the number in the household, but approximately \$10/person.

II. FUNERAL MEALS

Procedures have been put in place by Council for notification to the congregation of deaths via announcements in bulletins and church services/events, E-Vine calling list, and the Grapevine.

In the event the Pastor is the first contact, as in the past, he/she will contact a Coordinator and/or the WELCA President.

The Coordinator will contact the deceased family members to see if they would like to have a meal and the number to plan for. If the family chooses not to receive a meal, a memorial can be made in memory of the deceased (see Section III below).

After the Hospitality Coordinator talks with a family member, she/he will contact a Group Leader(s) to advise of the request if a meal is to be served giving them an estimated number for preparation of the meal. The meat can be reimbursed by the Church Treasurer upon request. (Remember to keep that receipt and follow the reimbursement procedures as outlined for the Stewardship and Finance Committee.)

The funeral meal will be for the family members of the deceased attending the funeral if at OSLC. If the funeral is elsewhere, then the meal may be delivered to the church family/active family at their home or designated site.

The Coordinator(s) will keep a list of each group who serves meals for whom, when, and how many were in attendance, if possible. This will be put in the minutes along with the number of cards sent from WELCA at a Joint Meeting for future reference.

Contacts to Group Leader(s) by the Coordinator(s) will be done by Group rotation.

III. MEMORIALS

It is the desire of the women of the church that a memorial be offered in lieu of a meal if the member family/active family (spouse, child, mother, or father) so desires according to the family's wishes. Generally, this is sent to OSLC Memorial and Gifts Fund in the name of that family; however, the family may desire another organization. The amount is stipulated in the WELCA Budget and/or Minutes and can be changed by the membership by voting rules in parliamentary procedure.

If a death occurs and the Pastor and/or the Coordinator(s)/WELCA President were not contacted in a timely manner, a memorial will be made to Our Saviour upon notification.
