COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



July 1 John Mason Neale, hymn translator (1818-1866)

While he was a student of classics at Cambridge University in his native England, John Neale participated in a movement for church renewal. Although he joined the priesthood, his poor health kept him from serving as a parish rector. He worked instead as warden of Sackville College. Neale's legacy to Christian worship consists of many hymn translations, most from ancient Greek and Latin sources. Fourteen of them appear in our ELW, including "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel": "Good Christian Friends, Reioice"; and "Christ is Made the Sure Foundation."

July 1 Catherine Winkworth, hymn translator (1827-1878)

English-speaking congregations are indebted to Catherine Winkworth for her translations of German hymns. Her work has made a wealth of hymn texts available. Nineteen appear in our ELW, including the much-loved "Now Thank We All Our God"; "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty"; and "O Living Bread From Heaven." Miss Winkworth spent most of her life in her native England, where she was an advocate for women's rights.

July 11 Benedict of Nursia, Abbot of Monte Cassino (480-ca. 540)

Educated in Rome, the Italian monk Benedict grew dissatisfied with the profligate life he witnessed there. He withdrew as a hermit for several years, attracting like-minded followers around him. Settling at Monte Cassino, he retreat and established ended his а monastery. Benedict wrote a rule, or guide, for monks to follow, and his order, the Benedictines, became known for hospitality to strangers and discipline that was neither burdensome nor indifferent to the traits of individual monks.
