COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15-17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



March 1 George Herbert, Hymn writer (1593 - 1633)

A Welshman by birth and an educated young man of many talents, George Herbert seemed destined for a position of influence, perhaps as a diplomat, since he was fluent in six languages. After his patron, King James the First, died, Herbert returned to his original intention of becoming a priest. He earned great respect in his vocation. After his death, his sincere, inventive religious poetry gained him an even broader hearing. Those poems and the hymns fashioned from them, including "Come My Way, My Truth, My Life" (ELW 816), plus several prose writings, still speak his message long after the end of his earthly life.

March 2 John Wesley (1703-1791) and Charles Wesley (1707-1788), Renewers of the church

Brothers John and Charles Wesley were ordained clergymen in the Church of England. After a discouraging missionary trip to the colony of Georgia in 1735, they returned home and came under the influence of Moravian pastors. In 1738. both John and Charles felt called to itinerant, evangelizing ministry. They and their followers were dubbed "Methodists," referring to the rigorous spiritual discipline they promoted. The Wesleys' movement, like Luther's effort to reform Catholicism, did not intend to sever ties with the Church

of England. It was not long after the Wesleys' deaths, however, that a formal separation of Methodism and Anglicanism took place. While John Wesley is best known as a founder of reputation Methodism, Charles Wesley's stems in large part from his accomplishments as a hymn writer. By 1756, he had left the itinerant preacher's way of life. He penned a multitude of hymns, many of which are staples of congregational worship today. Examples in our ELW include "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" (#270) and "Jesus Christ is Risen Todav" of (#365). Several Charles' descendants also became notable musicians and composers.

March 22 Jonathan Edwards. Teacher, missionary to American Indians (1703 - 1758)

A brilliant thinker and powerful preacher, Jonathan Edwards studied for the ministry after graduating from Yale at age Although his Puritan-inspired seventeen. writings about God's wrath are often cited in textbooks, he also spoke ardently about the grandeur of God's love and grace. А disagreement with his Massachusetts congregation about who should partake of in Edwards' Holy Communion resulted dismissal from that pastorate. It was then that he embarked on missionary work among Native Americans in western Massachusetts, coupled with extensive writing projects. In 1757 Edwards was elected president of what is now Princeton University. He died of smallpox a few months later.
