For example, if the families and people most intimately involved in the aftermath of the senseless shootings in Uvalde come to a sense of healing, that qualifies as a miracle to me.

Keep praying. And pray boldly.

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



June 1 Justin, martyr at Rome (c.100-c.165)

Born into a pagan family of Samaria, Justin became a devoted student of philosophy. His search for truth resulted in his conversion to Christianity, after which he taught at Ephesus and Rome and wrote treatises in defense of his religion. He and several of his students were denounced in Rome as Christians. When they refused to make a pagan sacrifice, they were beheaded.

June 3 The Martyrs of Uganda (died 1886)

The martyrs were victims of King Mwanga's persecution of Christians. First to die was Joseph Mkasa Balikuddembe, who was beheaded after accusing the king of both loose living and the murder of an Anglican missionary. Later on, thirty-two Catholic and Protestant men and boys, some of them servants of the king, were burned alive together. A missionary witnessed the horrible event, and the Catholic Church declared the victims saints in 1964.

June 5 Boniface, Bishop of Mainz Missionary to Germany Martyr (680-754)

Born an Englishman, Boniface is remembered best in Germany, for it is there that most of his life's work took place. As a young priest, Boniface went to Rome to ask the pope's permission to be a missionary to the German people. He spent the rest of his life preaching and setting up church organization there. He died at the hands of pagans during a missionary journey among the Frisians.

SCAMS

This seems to be an increasing problem. Scams that involve the use of someone you know attached to an dubious email address and an appeal for money or gift cards. I ALMOST fell for one of these myself with the bishop's name on it.

Making an appeal for money is part of my job. However, I will only make those in the Sunday morning announcements, the bulletin announcements, the Grapevine. Less likely, but possible, I may make an appeal from MY email address, oslcpastor@sc.rr.com, or from the e-vine, <u>evine@oursaviour.net</u>. Any other email address is a scam, regardless if my name or partial use email address (e.g. oslcpastor22@gmail.com would be a scam.)

If you get an email that looks fishy, here's what to do:

• Do not respond to that email.

• Block that email address, if you know how.

• Delete that email.

You do not need to tell me that you received it.

As long as you don't respond, no harm will come.
