Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

On Ash Wednesday, you were invited—

"As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament."

How's it going?

I think many times we imagine Lent to be FORTY SOLID DAYS of these disciplines. I'm not so sure. No one I know is going to practice 40 days of sacrificial giving. No one I know is going to go 40 days without food. No. Of course not. We always modify these disciplines. And the point, I believe, is not that we make these disciplines into 40 day endeavors, but that in the 40 days of Lent, we include these disciplines somewhere along the way.

I write this to encourage you. Maybe you had grand ambitions of your Lenten disciplines that have yet to come to fruition. Maybe you imagined a more rigorous prayer life, and it just hasn't really started. How about you start now? Give a prayer to God right now. Worry about tomorrow's prayer tomorrow.

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



March 10 Harriet Tubman, Renewer of society (1821-1913)

Born into slavery in Maryland, Harriet Tubman fled north, using the stars to guide her, around 1849. During the 1850s she repeatedly ventured back into slave territory to lead hundreds of slaves, including her parents, to freedom, as the "Moses" of her people. Tubman was part of the Underground Railroad, a network of safe houses and assistance for slaves desiring to escape. During the Civil War she served the Union army as cook, nurse, and spy. For the rest of her life, Harriet Tubman was in charge of a home for poor and elderly African-Americans in Auburn, New York.

March 12 Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome (540-604)

Gregory I (to distinguish him from 15 later popes named Gregory) began his working life as a well-to-do civil official in Rome. He had used his own money to construct seven Benedictine monasteries; in his mid-thirties, he renounced worldly success and entered one of them as a monk. He was appointed to several positions in the church before being elected pope in 590, the first monk to attain such high office. As pope, Gregory sought to be "servant of the servants of God," in his words.

March 29 Hans Nielsen Hauge Renewer of the church (1771-1824)

After an intense mystical experience at age twenty-five, Hans Hauge, a farmer's son, was convinced that he should rouse his fellow Norwegians to a new awareness of God's salvation. At that time in Norway, itinerant preaching was illegal, but Hauge, a layperson, took his message all across the country from 1797 to 1804. He was frequently arrested, jailed, and fined, but he gathered quite a following. After a lengthy prison term and considerable personal hardship, stopped his travels and settled on a farm near Oslo to write. In later life, he gained the respect of many church leaders. One of Hauge's central ideas is the very Lutheran belief in vocation as a form of service to God. And, although he often disputed with the official church of Norway, Hauge never advocated separation from it.
