COMMEMORATION PROFILES Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



July 6 Jan Hus, martyr (c. 1372 -1415)

Jan Hus began life in a Bohemian peasant family. After studying theology in Prague, he became a Catholic priest. Influenced by the writings of English reformer John Wycliffe, Hus began speaking against abuses in the church of his day, including the selling of indulgences, much as Martin Luther would do a century later. Hus was forbidden preach to and then excommunicated for insubordination toward the Catholic hierarchy. At the Council of found Constance, he was quilty of heresy. On July 6, 1415, Hus was burned at the stake. His followers, called the Czech Brethren, formed the nucleus of the Moravian Church.

July 12 Nathan Söderblom, Bishop of Uppsala (1866 -1931)

Student in his native Sweden and later in France, Nathan Söderblom became a Church of Sweden minister and also a university professor. He sought to invigorate the worship life of his church by revising its psalmbook and hymnal. An intellectual himself, he wanted the church to work harder to reach both intellectuals and working-class Swedes who had become alienated from it. Most of all, following World War I, Söderblom was convinced that Christian churches needed to overcome their differences and work together ecumenically to combat the ills of this world. Conferences he organized led to the establishment of the World Council of Churches. Söderblom was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1930.

July 23 Birgitta of Sweden, Renewer of the church (c. 1303 -1373)

A woman of privilege, chief lady-in-waiting to Swedish aueen. Birgitta the was nevertheless a critic of wickedness among the upper classes. She married and had four daughters. Her husband died when she was In her widowhood, Birgitta thirty-eight. became committed to religious life and gave all she owned to the poor. She founded an order of monks and nuns, the Order of the Holy Savior. Its cloister became an important Swedish religious and cultural center during the Middle Ages. Birgitta died while returning from a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Today the Society of St. Birgitta, a laypersons' association, continues her charitable work.
