We are now in the transition process. The church council has voted to accept the synod- appointed interim, Pastor Christine Parham. Church council will be meeting with her on Monday, July 24, to create a covenant. We are anticipating her start date to be Aug 6. This is a part-time position, and Pastor Parham will lead us in worship and help guide us through this transition.

What's next? Our July 30 worship service will take place in the Fellowship Hall. We did not request a supply pastor, so we will not be having communion. We will have a service with hymns. Council will update the congregation regarding our financial obligations and allow the congregation to ask questions, make comments and express any concerns about the road ahead. We will serve lunch following the service. Please feel free to dress casually.

If any of you are interested in reviewing the transition packet, it can be found on the SC Synod website: Scsynod.com. Once on the website, select "congregation" at the top, then "Call Process & Compensation"; download "Congregational transition packet resources.".

Moving forward, we will need to complete several congregational assessments, to include a sustainability evaluation, a vitality process, and development of a congregational ministry site profile. These will need to be completed prior to forming a call committee. Our constitution allows for six members to serve on the call committee.

While searching for a new pastor is not a speedy process, it will be important for the congregation to respond in a timely fashion when input is requested. It is also important for all of us to participate in keeping our church operating. We are the church, together.

There was no regular church council meeting in July, but the council did meet with Pastor Rick Carter, Assistant to the Bishop of the South Carolina Synod, to discuss the transition to a new pastor. Pastor Carter explained the call process, which could take up to a year. He recommended that we call as interim pastor the Reverend Christine Parham, who has recently served as interim at St. James, Sumter. Pastor Parham will guide the congregation through the several stages of the call process.

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



August 13
Florence Nightingale
Renewer of society
(1820-1910)

Florence Nightingale is one of two nurses the church calendar honors during the month of August. Often considered the founder of modern nursing, Nightingale supervised the care of wounded British soldiers during the Crimean War. Her high standards saved many lives. After her return to England, she founded a nursing school that became a model for such training. Florence Nightingale was the first woman to receive the British Order of Merit.

August 13 Clara Maass Renewer of society (1876-1901)

Clara Maass lost her life in a quest to find the cause of yellow fever. After studying in her native New Jersey and serving as a nurse in Cuba during the Spanish-American War, Maass volunteered for experiments. She survived one attack of yellow fever but succumbed to a second, at the age of twenty-five. In 1952, Newark German Hospital, where she had studied, was renamed Clara Maass Memorial Hospital in her honor.

August 20 Bernard, Abbot of Clairvaux (1090-1153)

Born in France, one of six brilliant sons of a nobleman, Bernard became a Cistercian monk at age twenty-three. Two years later he was made abbot of a new monastery at Clairvaux. It flourished under his leadership and sixtv-eight gave rise to other monasteries. Bernard was well-liked as a teacher and preacher, and he wrote extensively. Several hymn texts are attributed to him, including Jesus, the Very Thought of You (ELW hymn 754). The church declared him a saint in 1174.
