It's been a few months since anything has been in the *Grapevine* so here's a summary:

#### REPORT FROM THE SOUTH CAROLINA SYNODICAL CONVENTION — JUNE 24-25, 2023

- 1. In June, your President attended the SCWELCA Convention at Zion as your delegate and as the SC Triennial Coordinator.
- 2. Pam Hanfland, Sandra Hughes, Linda Hill, and Gail Marcum also attended as volunteers for the Saxe Gotha Conference. They did an outstanding job assisting with snacks and the meals. A big thank you to them.
- 3. A new Handbook for Churchwide Synodical Board, Conference, and Congregational Units was approved for distribution to units. Linda had the opportunity to go over the book and make suggestions from a congregational standpoint and found the book was in great order and had good explanations. Each Circle has one and I hope that your president/leader will pass it to the next president/leader. Also the original is located on the shelf in the copy room at the church if you ever need to refer to it.
- 4. Linda Griffith was appointed to serve out a term of a member of the Board who resigned earlier this year and asked not to be considered for election. Her duties on the board are now complete.
- 5. Currently Linda is completing plans for voting members to the Triennial—Christie Gardner, Pat George, Sarah Cheesman, LaTynia Taylor, and Cindy McManus as well as two others who will all be attending the *Gathering*. Linda will be in Phoenix, AZ from September 20-24.
- Synodical Vice President Amanda Boatwright (Leesville) resigned her position on the board due to personal reasons and Christie Gardner (Newberry) was appointed to fill her position until next election. Christie will also serve as the delegation chair to Triennial in the absence of President Risse Snelgrove.

 Offerings collected during convention were: Joy—\$3,370.82 which will support the ELCA Good Gifts Program; Convention—\$2,048.00. Camp Kinard received \$11,605.46 as our local project and 1,069 hygiene kits were collected for Tanzania plus \$410. The Newberry College Pantry received \$1,000.00.

**LYDIA CIRCLE (Action)**—has not met since May but will begin their new year in September. Plans are underway for a Fall Community Service Project. More details are forthcoming.

**CAMERON CIRCLE (Growth)** - continues to meet with the Rebekah Circle and are planning to have a date and speaker soon regarding WELCA Sunday.

**REBEKAH CIRCLE (Community)** – continues to meet with Cameron Circle. They met in July at Linda Hill's home and enjoyed a *potluck* lunch. They prepared and distributed thirteen bags with fruit to shut ins. They also met Monday, August 28 at 10:30 in the Fellowship hall to begin making plans for the church wide social this fall. Details will be in the bulletin.

**OTHER:** The LMM has asked WELCA to assist them again this year with their Annual Christmas Party. Date, time, and entertainment information will be provided soon.

## COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



September 2 Nikolai Frederik Severin Grundtvig, bishop, renewer of the church (1783-1872)

Nikolai Grundtvig, a nineteenth-century Danish theologian, had strong views about returning the church to Lutheran orthodoxy, centering on the Apostles' Creed and the sacraments. He was also an authority on Norse and Anglo-Saxon sagas and wrote poetry, including a Danish version of Beowulf. Lutherans know Grundtvig as the author of hymn texts such as "O Day Full of Grace" and "Built on a Rock."

#### September 17 Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen (1098-1179)

Born into a noble family in what is now Germany, Hildegard was presented to God as a tithe by her parents. She entered a convent and succeeded her teacher as its abbess. Hildegard had had visions even as a child, and in adulthood she compiled them into books, feeling that God intended this. In addition to her mysticism, Hildegard was famous for the poems and hymns she composed and her knowledge of natural history and medicine. She also advised popes and secular rulers. Even though she lived her entire adult life as a nun, Hildegard influenced the wider world of the Middle Ages and still speaks through her writings today. The words of hymn #399 ("O Holy Spirit, Root of Life") in the ELW are based on one of her compositions.

#### September 30 Jerome, translator, teacher (c. 347-420)

Jerome was a priest and scholar of the early church. After his baptism in Rome at age nineteen, he traveled widely on pilgrimages and continued to study, learning Hebrew as one of his endeavors. After admission to the priesthood, he received a papal commission to translate the Bible into Latin. Jerome's translation, known as the Vulgate, served as the standard Latin version for fifteen centuries after its completion.
