#### **Returning to the Lord: A Lenten Journey**

"Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." – Joel 2:13

Lent is a season that calls us back. Not just to church, not just to spiritual practices, but back to God's heart. It's not about proving how holy we are or how much we can give up. It's about remembering who we are and who God is.

This year, our Wednesday Lenten services will follow the words of Joel: **Return to the Lord your God.** Each week, we'll reflect on what it means to return—what we're turning from, what we're turning toward, and how God meets us in that turning.

Come join us on Wednesdays in Lent. Here are the themes and the ways we will be thinking about Returning to the Lord:

• March 12 – Return (*Luke 13:31-35*) Sometimes we wander. Sometimes we don't even realize we've wandered. Thank God that we have Jesus who calls us back, who longs to gather us under his wings. God isn't waiting for us to "get it together" - He just wants us to come home.

• **March 19** – **Reconciliation** (*Luke 13:1-9*) Returning to God isn't just a personal thing - it changes how we relate to others. We'll talk about what it means to be reconciled, how God gives us time to grow, and why grace is always bigger than we expect.

• **March 26** – **Righteousness** (*Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32*) The prodigal son didn't expect a party when he came home. But God's righteousness doesn't look like hard and fast rules or checklists to complete. It looks like love. What does it mean to live in that kind of love? What does it mean to let it change us?

- April 2 Restoration (John 12:1-8) Six days before the Passover, Mary kneels before Jesus and pours out expensive perfume, filling the house with its fragrance. Some call it wasteful, but Jesus calls it beautiful. Restoration isn't always about fixing what's broken sometimes it's about being fully present. How might God be calling us to that kind of restoration
- April 9 (Jesus') Resolution (*Luke 22:14–23:56*) The Last Supper. The garden. The betrayal. The trial. The cross. Jesus gives everything—His body, His dignity, His very life—out of love. This is the heart of sacrifice, not just in suffering but in self-giving. As we walk with Jesus through these final hours, we remember: this is love, poured out for us.

Lent isn't about earning or giving up anything. It's about stepping into God's vision for us and the love that's already there. It's about returning again and again - to the one who never leaves us. So, come as you are. Bring your questions, your doubts, your hopes, and your need for grace. Let's return to the Lord together.

#### COMMEMORATION PROFILES Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



#### March 2 John Wesley (1703-1791) and Charles Wesley (1707-1788) Renewers of the church

Brothers John and Charles Wesley were ordained clergymen in the Church of England. After a discouraging missionary trip to the colony of Georgia in 1735, they returned home and came under the influence of Moravian pastors. In 1738. both John and Charles felt called to itinerant, evangelizing ministry. They and their followers were dubbed "Methodists," referring to the rigorous spiritual discipline they promoted. The Wesleys' movement, like Luther's effort to reform Catholicism. did not intend to sever ties with the Church of England. It was not long after the Wesleys' deaths, however, that a formal separation of Methodism and Anglicanism took place. While John Wesley is best known as a founder of Methodism, Charles Wesley's reputation stems in large part from his accomplishments as a hymn writer. By 1756, he had left the itinerant preacher's way of life. He penned a multitude of hymns, many of which are congregational staples of worship today. Examples in our ELW include "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" (#270) and "Jesus Christ Is Risen Today" (#365). Several of Charles' descendants also became notable musicians and composers.

#### March 12 Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome (540-604)

Gregory the First (to distinguish him from fifteen later popes named Gregory) began his working life as a well-to-do civil official in Rome. He had used his own money to construct seven Benedictine monasteries. In his mid-thirties, he renounced worldly success and entered one of them as a monk. He was appointed to several positions in the church before being elected pope in 590, the first monk to attain such high office. As pope, Gregory sought to be "servant of the servants of God," in his words. He did much to help people hurt by famine, disease, and war, as well as to reform clergy practices and church liturgy. Gregory also sent missionaries to convert England to Christianity. The term "Gregorian chant" refers to his influence on church music. The ELW contains one hymn text-"Lord God. We You" (#558)—attributed Praise to Gregory the Great.

The Brookland-Cayce High School Education Foundation is excited to announce the induction of Mrs. Beth Cleland into the Brookland-Cayce High School Educator Hall of Fame. Mrs. Cleland served over 28 years in education, teaching at Brookland-Cayce High School from 1982-1991 and 1994-2014.

She was certified to teach AP Government and Economics and served as a coaching teacher. She was a longtime volleyball coach at Brookland-Cayce, finishing in 2006-2007 as 3A state champion runner-up, and was selected as a Volleyball Coach of the Year. She also coached softball for 4 years. She was a member of Alpha Delta Kappa, served on the School Improvement Data Team and the SC Department of Educational Instructional Materials Review Panel, and formed a lunchtime grief group for students as a safe place to share their experiences. She and her husband have attended Our Savior Lutheran for the past 41 years, participating in the choir, church council, and tellers.
