Spring is unfolding all around us. The trees that stood bare all winter are beginning to bud. Flowers are pushing up through the soil. Birds are singing again, as if they know something we don't. I hope each of you has found a way to enjoy and soak in the quiet but definite resurrection happening in nature.

The natural world is clearing the path and guiding the church toward the most sacred days of the year - the **Triduum**. The Triduum is the three-day journey through Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. These days carry us into the heart of our faith and are the culmination of the church year. The three days (from sundown on Thursday to sundown on Sunday) are seen and experienced as one liturgical day.

On **Maundy Thursday**, we gather around the table, just as Jesus did with his disciples. He breaks the bread, pours the wine, and kneels to wash their feet in an act of radical humility and service. This is more than a symbolic gesture; it is a command (mandatum in Latin) to embody love in action. As Jesus tells his disciples, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another" (John 13:34). This night marks the institution of both the Lord's Supper and the new **commandment** - a way of life shaped by self-giving love.

Then comes Good Friday. At first glance, it hardly seems "good." We stand at the foot of the cross as the weight of human sin and suffering is laid upon Jesus. He breathes his last. The world holds its breath. And yet, even in this moment of apparent defeat, the mystery of God's grace is at work. Christ's love does not recoil from suffering but enters into it fully, transforming the cross from an instrument of death into a symbol of redemption.

Holy Saturday follows - a day of stillness, uncertainty, and waiting. It is the in-between space, the pause between despair and hope. In the silence of the tomb, God is still at work, though unseen. This day invites us to trust in the unseen movements of God's grace, even when all appears lost.

And then comes **Easter!** The impossible happens. Jesus is risen, and nothing is ever the same again. Resurrection is not just a return to life but the dawn of a **new creation**, where sin and death no longer have the final word. Easter is the foundation of our faith, the assurance that in Christ, life triumphs over death, love overcomes hate, and hope is never in vain.

These three days - the **Triduum** - are not just a remembrance of past events. They are a journey we step into each year, shaping our faith and our lives. Through them, we are reminded that love serves, grace redeems, and resurrection is the promise that changes everything. And the story continues! Easter isn't just one day - it's a whole season, **50 days long**.

On that first **Easter day**, the disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24) don't recognize Jesus at first. They're caught in their grief, their disappointment, and their wondering about what comes next. As the three of them walk together, Jesus opens the scriptures to them. But it isn't until they sit at the table and he **breaks the bread** that their eyes are opened. Christ is alive - and he has been with them all along.

This is the heart of **Eastertide**: resurrection is not just a past event - it's a present reality. Christ is still walking with us, still bringing new life to weary hearts and broken places.

So as we step into this Easter season, I invite you to look for resurrection moments at OSLC and in your own life. Where is God offering you a fresh start? Where is grace bigger than you expected? Where is Christ walking alongside you - even when you don't recognize him at first?

New life is in the season. New life is in Christ. And new life is ours!

COMMEMORATION PROFILES Ruth Nicholson

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



April 6 Albrecht Dürer, artist (1471-1528)

Son of a goldsmith, who began the young man's training, Dürer became a leading artist of the German Renaissance. Though his paintings and drawings are well known, his greatest works are said to be his woodcuts and engravings. Dürer is known for the careful attention to detail in his portrayal of subjects from nature and from the Christian tradition. Though a Catholic to the end, Dürer felt sympathy for the Reformation and was a friend of Luther and Melanchthon.

April 6 Matthias Grünewald, artist (c. 1475-1529)

Matthias Grünewald, a contemporary of Dürer, is another great painter of the German Renaissance. He was influenced Dürer's style, his greatest by and masterpiece, the Isenheim Altarpiece, was thought for a long time to be one of Dürer's That altarpiece depicts the creations. Annunciation, angels singing for Mary and her child, the crucifixion of Jesus, and Jesus' resurrection. Historians believe that Grünewald was a Protestant and a supporter of Martin Luther.

April 6 Lucas Cranach the Elder, artist (1472-1553)

The third great painter of the German Renaissance who is celebrated on this date is Lucas Cranach, called "The Elder" to distinguish him from his son Lucas, who was also an artist. Cranach the Elder probably learned engraving from his father. At about thirty years of age, he began painting portraits. In 1504. Cranach became court painter to Frederick the Third in Wittenberg, and he and Martin Luther became close friends there. Cranach painted portraits of Luther and other reformers, and some of his woodcuts were used to illustrate the New Testament first printed in German. As with Grünewald, Cranach's work shows the influence of other artists of his time. Parts of his creative output were mistaken for theirs until three or more centuries after his death.


