See, I am making all things new -Revelation 21:5

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! It is still Easter—and also spring-quickly -turning-into-summer. The tulips are blooming, the sun is sticking around longer in the evenings, and all around us, resurrection hope is in the air. I bring you a little hope, too, from the mountains of North Carolina, where I recently attended Create in Me at Lutheridge—a continuing education retreat filled with art, worship, music, and deep conversations. One of the highlights was hearing from author and theologian Jacqueline Bussie, who shared powerfully about wounds, scars, healing, and hope.

One takeaway stayed with me: God is not done creating. Not in the world, not in the church, and certainly not in you. I've been carrying that thought alongside a little verse from Revelation that's been echoing in my heart: See, I am making all things new. Not will make, not might make—but am making. Right now. Present tense. Even in the mess. Even in the quiet. Even in us.

Speaking of carrying things, I had actual rocks in my pocket on Palm Sunday. I was ready to give a children's sermon that morning, about how you can tell the whole story of Holy Week—and even the entire Easter season—with just two things: palms and rocks. That particular children's moment didn't end up happening (sometimes the Spirit rewrites the plan!), but the image has stayed with me.

Palms are for praise and hope—like when we shouted "Hosanna!" and sang All Glory, Laud, and Honor. Rocks are for grief and silence—like the stone placed in front of the tomb. But they're also for resurrection—the stone rolled away. Our lives, like our faith, are full of both: joy and resistance, dying and rising. Moments of waving palms, and moments of carrying heavy stones. And through it all, God is making all things new.

COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



May 4 Monica, mother of Augustine (c. 331-387)

Widowed at age forty, mother of three, Monica especially hoped that the eldest, Augustine, would convert to her beloved Christianity. Augustine's ways were not her ways; he had, for example, fathered a child out of wedlock. It was only after he and Monica traveled to Italy to be with Christian leaders there that Augustine's conversion and baptism took place. Before they could finish the return trip to North Africa, Monica became sick and died. Augustine wrote at length in his *Confessions* about the pious life his mother led and the example she had given for others to follow.

May 8 Julian of Norwich, Renewer of the church (1342 - c. 1416)

History has given us few facts concerning Julian's life. She was one of medieval Christianity's female mystics. Her visions of Christ were collected in a book, Sixteen Revelations of Divine Love. Julian was a nun living alone in a room attached to a church in Norwich, England. Her revelations came to her, she said, during an illness. In them, Julian sees Christ as a mother-figure whose love, like the ideal mother's, lasts forever in spite of children's disobedience and the need for parental discipline from time to time. To Julian, love is central to religious experience.

May 18 Erik, King of Sweden, Martyr (died 1160)

Erik IX was Sweden's ruler from 1150 to his death in 1160. Midway through his reign, he launched an expedition to Finland which enabled the Christian church to gain a foothold there. He lost his life during an attack by rebels who were aided by a Danish prince. Known for his genuine goodness, Erik is venerated as the principal patron saint of his country.



This year's Synod Assembly holds special meaning as we celebrate **200 years of ministry in South Carolina**. In partnership with the 200th Anniversary Planning Team, we have selected **Psalm 100** as our theme scripture:

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

Worship the Lord with gladness;
come before him with joyful songs...

For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;
his faithfulness continues through all generations."

This psalm captures the heart of our celebration—God's enduring faithfulness across generations, past, present, and future.

The Assembly is more than business; it's a time of worship, storytelling, learning, and connection. We'll lift up inspiring ministry happening throughout the Synod and reflect on how God continues to work through faithful congregations, leaders, and communities.

A key moment this year will be the **election of a new Synod Vice President**. With Deacon Lexanne Graves' term coming to a close, we now enter a season of **prayerful discernment**. A brief job description has been created to help guide this process. We encourage you to read it and consider whether the Holy Spirit may be calling you—or someone you know—to be nominated.
