- Psalm 119:105 (KJV)

Dear Beloved People of Our Saviour,

That verse has been a favorite for generations - sung in songs, written on bookmarks, stitched into needlepoint, whispered in hospital rooms. God's Word shows us the way, giving us light to take the next faithful step.

Recently, a few of you have asked me about a new Bible translation you've heard mentioned - something called the **NRSVue** (The New Revised Standard Version updated edition). So, let's take a few moments together to unpack what this is, why it matters, and what it means for us as a congregation.

#### A Little Background

The Bible translation most commonly used in ELCA congregations (including ours!) has been the NRSV, the New Revised Standard Version, published in 1989. Before that, many churches used the RSV. The updated edition - the NRSVue - comes after years of careful, faithful work by scholars from the Society of Biblical Literature, in partnership with the National Council of Churches. (And it's not just the ELCA making this change - Roman Catholic, Episcopalian, Methodist, and 28 other denominations are in the same boat!)

This update points to a truth we know well: we are always learning. Biblical scholars are continually going back to the oldest manuscripts for deeper understanding. The goal of the NRSVue is to reflect the best of what we've learned - through new archaeological findings, improved manuscripts, and ongoing conversations around faithful language.

#### What This Means for Us

Starting in June 2025, Sundays and Seasons - our go-to resource for the weekly readings and bulletin texts - will switch to using the NRSVue. This change is in keeping with copyright law and reflects the wishes of the National Council of Churches. Many other denominations are making this transition as well. (This is similar to the shift that happened back in 1989 when the NRSV replaced the RSV.)

You may notice some small differences in wording between what's printed in your bulletin and what you see in your pew Bible. That's okay! In fact, I invite you to listen closely, to hear the living Word anew - and bring your questions or observations to the table. These are wonderful starting points for conversation and spiritual curiosity.

#### The Heart of It

The Word of God is not just ink on a page. It is living and active. The Bible is not a museum relic - it's the cradle that holds the Christ child. Martin Luther once wrote that Scripture is "the swaddling clothes and the manger in which Christ lies." What a tender, holy image.

When we hear the Word read aloud in worship, when we proclaim it from the pulpit, when we carry it home in our hearts - it is alive. Not because of perfect translation or perfect understanding, but because the Holy Spirit moves in and through that Word to bring us life.

Every time we open Scripture, God meets us. That's the power of the proclaimed and heard Word of God. It doesn't just tell us what happened long ago. It tells us what God is doing right now - in your life, in our world, in our shared story of faith. And that's why both translations of Psalm 119:105 are beautiful. The KJV language - "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet" - has shaped our memories and melodies. And the updated NRSVue version - "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" - still carries that same light, in words that may feel closer to how we speak today.

Both are the living Word of God. Both shine with truth. Both lead us home to Christ.

Thanks be to God for the Word that walks with us, step by step.

#### **COMMEMORATION PROFILES**

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



#### June 1 Justin, martyr at Rome (c. 100 - c. 165)

Born into a pagan family of Samaria, Justin became a devoted student of philosophy. His search for truth resulted in his conversion to Christianity, after which he taught at Ephesus and Rome and wrote treatises in defense of his religion. He and several of his students were denounced in Rome as Christians. When they refused to make a pagan sacrifice, they were beheaded.

#### June 3 The Martyrs of Uganda (died 1886)

These martyrs were victims of King Mwanga's persecution of Christians. First to die was Joseph Mkasa Balikuddembe, who was beheaded after accusing the king of both loose living and the murder of an Anglican missionary. Later on, thirty-two Catholic and Protestant men and boys, some of them servants of the king, were burned alive together. A missionary witnessed the horrible event, and the Catholic Church declared the victims saints in 1964.



#### June 5 Boniface, Bishop of Mainz, missionary to Germany, martyr (680-754)

Born an Englishman, Boniface is remembered best in Germany, for it is there that most of his life's work took place. As a young priest, Boniface went to Rome to ask the pope's permission to be a missionary to the German people. He spent the rest of his life preaching and setting up church organization there. He died at the hands of pagans during a missionary journey among the Frisians.

## NRSVUE: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I need to buy a new Bible?

Not at all! Your current Bible is still a faithful witness to God's Word. The changes in the NRSVue are relatively small, and the heart of the gospel remains the same. But if you're curious about the updates, you're welcome to explore them.

Where can I read the NRSVue online?

You can read the NRSVue for free on websites like Bible Gateway or StudyLight.org, or through Bible apps that have added the updated edition. Just look for "NRSVue" in the list of translations.

Will we be getting new pew Bibles?

Not at this time. Our current pew Bibles still serve us well. We'll continue using them alongside the new readings in the bulletin. As we move forward, we may revisit this as a congregation.

### What kind of changes should I expect?

Most of the updates are small—things like slightly clearer phrasing, more inclusive language, or footnotes that reflect new scholarship. You might notice different word choices ("sons" becomes "children," for example), but the core message stays the same.

Why does this kind of update matter?

Because God's Word is for today. And as our understanding grows—through history, archaeology, and study—we do our best to listen more carefully and faithfully. Scripture is always alive, always speaking, always drawing us closer to Christ.
