## Pastor's Ponderings: Listening for the Spirit Among Us

As we move into February, our life together as a faith community is being shaped by listening. We know that good conversations require both speaking and listening, yet so often we are busy forming our next response before we have truly heard one another. This season invites us into a different way of paying attention—a kind of holy listening that trusts the Spirit is already at work among us, calling and inviting us into what comes next.

The Sundays after Epiphany are giving way to Lent. The days are slowly lengthening with light, and before long it will be spring. Epiphany is all about revelation - of God made known. Lent invites us to slow down and stay with what we have noticed and allow it to shape us. This year, our focus will be on Holy Conversations. Like last year, our Wednesday noon prayer service will ground us in prayer, discussion, silence, and attention to God's Word.

Each Wednesday at noon, we will gather around one guiding question. The service will center on the gospel reading for the week. Each story brings us into a different conversation with Jesus. We begin in the wilderness, listening for the voices that shape our sense of power and identity. We move into the nighttime questions of Nicodemus, where trust is invited even when understanding seems incomplete. At the well with the Samaritan woman, we hear about living water and new community. With the man born blind, we listen for how faith grows through the courage to speak. At the tomb with Martha and Mary, grief and hope are held together in the promise of resurrection.

As Holy Week approaches, we listen.

This posture of listening is shaping more than our worship life. It is shaping how we live together as a congregation. In the year ahead, we will continue to name and nurture the ministries that give life to us and to our neighbors. As teams begin planning for gatherings like Mardi Gras, the Easter Egg Hunt, Vacation Bible School, and the Fall Festival, we do so with gratitude for the energy these ministries bring and with care for how they form us. These are places where relationships grow, where our presence in the community becomes visible, and where the gospel takes shape.

This season also invites us to pause and ask faithful questions: Who are we right now? What is God already doing among us? How are we being called to respond? In our work in congregational council, we are being encouraged to listen more deeply - to notice what gives life, attend what is ready to grow, and name honestly what we see needs to be pruned.

When we listen well, we are freed to focus our energy on what is truly formative and life-giving.

Thank you for the care, commitment, and faithfulness every single one of you bring to this community. I am grateful to serve alongside you, and I am excited for what God is already up to among us as we listen for the Spirit together.

## COMMEMORATION PROFILES

*Ruth Nicholson*

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



**February 14**  
**Cyril, monk (826-869) and**  
**Methodius, bishop (c. 815-885),**  
**missionaries to the Slavs**

Cyril and Methodius were brothers from a noble family in Greece. In 860, Cyril resigned a job in Constantinople to join his brother on missionary trips to the Khazars and Bulgarians. Two years later, Emperor Michael III sent them to Moravia to preach the Gospel. Instead of using the Latin liturgy, these brothers used the Slavonic vernacular, now called Old Church Slavonic. In addition, they developed a new alphabet in order to translate the Bible into the local language. Cyril's and Methodius's work had a sacred dimension, as they spread Christianity, and a secular one, as their linguistic contributions were valuable for the beginnings of Slavic literature.

**February 18**  
**Martin Luther,**  
**Renewer of the church**  
**(1483-1546)**

Founder of the Protestant Reformation, Martin Luther formulated a new understanding of humanity's relationship with God. He recognized Jesus as the only mediator between people and God; he identified grace as the key element in forgiveness and salvation; and for him, word and sacrament were the key components of worship. Luther's translation of the Bible from churchly Latin into everyday German was a tremendous gift to Christianity and culture in Germany. His catechisms, tracts, letters, sermons and hymns remain powerful sources of education and inspiration for Christians around the world today.

**February 25**  
**Elizabeth Fedde,**  
**Deaconess**  
**(1850-1921)**

Born on Christmas Day, 1850, in Norway, Elizabeth Fedde trained to be a deaconess. At age thirty-two, she was called to New York to minister to the poor and to Norwegian seamen. Her first accomplishment there was the establishment of the Norwegian Relief Society. Shortly thereafter, she opened the Deaconess House in Brooklyn and the Deaconess House and Hospital of the Lutheran Free Church in Minneapolis. She returned to Norway in 1895 and died there on February 25, 1921.
